In addition to our own 17 Irish WS campers, we had 8 international attendees this year. Five travelled from Italy, one from France, one from Holland and, of course our Rosie from UK. Our international campers always bring something new, different and special to the camp. It was lovely to meet and befriend them, learn a little of their languages and culture, and make life long friends with them. I know that they will all keep in touch, at least on facebook. The camp began on Sunday 3rd August. We arrived to a hive of activity, as each camper and volunteer arrived during the course of the afternoon. Teacher Support Group Meeting

On Saturday 17 May there was a first support-group meeting for teachers of children with WS who are in primary school or special schools. It was a great afternoon, attended by both teachers and SNAs. The feedback was very positive and this will now be an annual event. The participants really enjoyed hearing the stories of other children with WS from one another and sorting out aspects of the child's profile that were specifically Williams-related and those that were just part of the child's personality. I made a number of specific presentations on the day:

Accommodating the WS educational profile in the classroom

Dealing with distractibility and other behavioural issues in WS

Dealing with motor-skill challenges

Developing literacy in learners with WS

These presentations and a number of academic articles and teaching resources were also made available to the participants and put on memory keys.

Developing a balanced reading programme for teaching a child with WS

Research review: Williams syndrome: a critical review of the cognitive, behavioural and neuroanatomical phenotype

Attention Deficit/Hyperactivity Disorder and WS: shared behavioural and neuropsychological profiles

Anxiety and repetitive behaviours in Autism spectrum disorders and WS: A cross-syndrome comparison

Teaching creative dramatics to young adults with WS
